Northwest Bronx Community & Clergy Coalition Benefits of Membership for Affiliated Organizations

NWBCCC will strengthen the capacity of Affiliated Organizations to realize their values in the world by providing training and organizing assistance to groups that wish to energize their membership, develop new leaders, identify social justice issues that are important to them, and take action. Affiliated Organizations can:

- Join the Clergy Caucus.* Clergy from all faiths are welcome to join monthly luncheons where we reflect on the theological roots of social justice, learn about effective ways to build your congregation by using the skills of organizing, and develop relationships with clergy across a wide range of religious denominations.
- Start a Faith in Action Group in your congregation or Social Justice Group in your secular organization.* NWBCCC has a step-by-step method for helping congregations and other organizations identify and train leaders, build a core team, energize the congregation or organization by building relationships, and move into action on local and community issues.
- Participate in the standing campaign committees of the organization* (Affordable Housing, Community Benefits at the Kingsbridge Armory, Education Reform, and Sistas and Brothas United Youth Leadership Program). People who participate in these campaign committees will receive training on a wide range of leadership skills such as public speaking, running effective meetings, negotiation, campaign strategy, and more from experienced community organizers and leaders.
- Nominate two leaders and an alternate to sit on the Northwest Bronx Leadership Council.* People who participate in either the Leadership Council will meet several times per year. Participants will build diverse relationships and receive training from the senior staff and Co-Directors on local and national issues, building a powerful organization, strategic planning, and more.
- Nominate one candidate for the NWBCCC Board of Directors.* People who participate on the Board will meet several times per year to make decisions about the fiscal and management aspects of the organization. Board members will build diverse relationships and receive training on fundraising, financial management, evaluation, and more.
- Cast up to twenty-five votes at the Annual Meeting or Special Meetings of the Members* provided that there is a representative present to cast each vote.
- Receive excellent national training through the National Training and Information Center (www.ntic-us.org), Gamaliel Foundation (www.gamaliel.org) and the Center for Community Change (www.communitychange.org).* NWBCCC will pay for selected active leaders to attend week-long training or conferences at national organizations.
